Cherokee legend reveals the story of the Great Leech, living in a deep hole below the old rock ledge crossing in the Valley River. Known among the Cherokees as Tianusi'yi, The Leech Place can be seen from the River Walk bridge overlook. The legendary giant leech, with its and white striped red
